- 6. Do a treasure hunt to find objects by going window shopping, followed by a special morning tea.
- 7. Go to the movies at Te Ahu Cinemas. Tickets are \$8 for children under 14 and \$13 for adults or \$37 for a family of two adults and two children. Go to kaitaianz.co.nz for times
- 8. Visit the Museum @ Te Ahu to learn local history. The museum is open Monday to Friday 8.30am to 4.30pm from 2 January.
- 9. Go to the Saturday morning markets in Kaitaia, Mangonui or Doubtless Bay, or the Mangonui Night Markets on Tuesdays.
- 10. Make a veggie garden with your kids. You can also make a game out of watering.





