Year after year thousands of plastic bottles end up in our oceans where currents distribute them on the shores around the world. If not littering our foreshores, marine animals either ingest or tangle themselves normally to their early demise.

In Indonesia, intense tourism and limited access to clean drinking water means millions of plastic bottles are used and disposed of, not always consciously. As a result, the debris scattered on the shores of this beautiful country has become a mammoth problem. Due to a lack of access to education in small towns, locals do not always know what to do with all this pollution, and much of it ends up in the Pacific Ocean. One Planet Bags was created to try and save our oceans from plastic.

These bags are made in a small village in Java, Indonesia, from used plastic bottles collected from beaches, streets, and waterways. Continued education means the local residents are learning the importance of keeping our oceans and waterways clean, resulting in employment that was otherwise non-existent. The plastic is taken to a factory where a machine reconstitutes the bottles into strips before it is taken to villages where the women hand-weave it into the bags you see today.

The Indonesian people involved with making these bags are paid well, earning the same salary as a teacher in Indonesia. They are learning about the environment and the ocean and are leading by example for neighbouring villages. A wonderful offshoot of the bags is that people are returning home, enjoying family and embracing their heritage.

Harcourts Bay of Islands are proud to be involved with such an initiative that is helping to clean up our oceans, improve education, and provide employment. Business owner, Tom Rutherford says he immediately saw the potential for the team. "The Far North is a region that represents the birth of New Zealand, with amazing history and a stunning coastline. We just saw this as a way of helping the environment and promoting our world class local produce. From wines to chutneys, chocolate, candles and olive oil... the list is a long one and the bags are stuffed to overflowing. We are so excited to promote what the team at Harcourts see as a win-win. By utilising local produce, we also have a low carbon footprint.
