A new face for Far North Alzheimer's

Kia ora kotou,

My name is Margot Ah Sam and I have recently started as the Far North Community Advisor for Alzheimer's Northland. I am privileged to provide support, information and education to people in our region who are affected by dementia.

I'm on the road visiting families in their homes, meeting them at my office here at Community House in Kaitaia and I also run support groups. Each month I hold a Carer Support Group for those who are caring for a loved one at home who has dementia. This month we are also kicking off a new group where people with dementia and their whanau can come together for a cuppa and to connect and socialise.

Four out of every five New Zealanders knows or has known someone with dementia. Over 70,000 whanau are affected by dementia and this figure is expected to triple by 2050!

My own family has been affected by dementia so I'm aware that the journey can be challenging for whanau and people can experience feelings of stress, loss, or have trouble adjusting to their condition. Therefore, our free services are designed to enhance greater understanding of a dementia diagnosis, as well as on-going support for people to live well and plan for the future.

Everyone's story is different. Every family is affected in different ways but we are stronger together. A powerful whakatauki that I think applies to families affected by dementia is this:

Waiho i te toipoto, kaua i te toiroa

"Let us keep close together, not far apart"

EnergyMate

Kaitaia Family Budgeting is partnering with the electricity sector to deliver EnergyMate, a free in-home energy coaching service helping 100 families at high risk of energy hardship—when a family is struggling to pay the power bill or keep their home warm.

EnergyMate is delivered by communitybased financial mentors and is being sponsored by local lines company Top Energy, alongside power companies and other lines companies across New Zealand.

During an in-home visit, EnergyMate coaches connect the household with their power company to ensure they're on the most cost-effective power plan and payment terms and which take into account their wider circumstances.

Coaches also give advice on heating the home cheaply and on using appliances efficiently, check hot water and shower flow, and deliver free LED lightbulbs for instant power savings.

Combined, these steps can help a house-hold make significant savings. Some can save hundreds of dollars a year by getting on a power plan which is better suited to them, or by implementing simple energy saving tips. Those savings can then be put towards the things that matter most—like having a warm, dry, healthy home.


